English:

- Activities include oral language, literacy activities, group reading, guided reading groups, reading and comprehension strategies, spelling, phonics, writing and handwriting
- This term we will focus on narrative and procedure writing
- Each day we will have a focus sound which will be reflected in our Big Book of the week, handwriting and other activities
- Students will continue to focus on spelling sounds and sorts through weekly Word Study
- Looking closely at grammar rules; including punctuation, adjectives, nouns, verbs.

Mathematics:

- Counting strategies: Rainbow Facts, Doubles, Near Doubles, Turnarounds, Friendly Numbers
- Recognise and describe one-half as one of two equal parts of a whole. (ACMNA016)
- Recognise, describe and order Australian coins according to their value (ACMNA017)
- Addition and Subtraction Represent and solve simple problems using a range of strategies including counting on, partitioning and rearranging parts (ACMNA015)
- Multiplication and Division Groups and shares collections of objects equally. Records the grouping and sharing informally. (ACMNA015)

- Introduction to word processing using Microsoft Word
