CHESS

The warmer weather of late has certainly put a spring in our players' steps towards better and greater things!

In the last school holidays, two chess tournaments were held. In the Adelaide Hills Open, Ethan R. (Yr 5) was equal 1st (Rated Players). In the SA U8-U11 State Championships, Athena-Malar R. (Yr 3), Caleb T. (Yr 5) and Ethan R. (Yr 5) were crowned the U9, U10 and U11 State Champions, respectively. Congratulations!!

Then on the Friday of the first week of term, East Marden chess players participated at the Evelyn Koshnitsky Shield, which is an annual tournament - by invitation only - when the top chess playing primary schools vie for the Best Primary Chess School title. Other schools in this year's event were: Prince Alfred College, North Adelaide Primary School and Linden Park Primary School.

East Marden sent in its top chess playing students from across the A, B and C Grades to give it the best chance in this tournament. They were: Ethan (Yr 5), Athena-Malar (Yr 3), Nikita (Yr 7), Sree (Yr 7), Gautam (Yr 7), Caleb (Yr 5), Deklan (Yr 6), Sanggeetha (Yr 6), Charles (Yr 2), Leon (Yr 2) and Suhas (Yr 4). Each one had to play 3 rounds, which was challenging, in particular after a long day at school.



After some very close games and tight results, East Marden secured the title with 21.5 points out of 30 and was 2.5 points ahead of its nearest rival, Prince Alfred College. It was an outcome achieved by tremendous individual effort and fantastic teamwork by everyone. Well done, everyone!

Last but not least, the most heartfelt gratitude from the A Grade Chess Team (which is photographed with the prestigious A Grade Shield here) to the school community and their families in supporting their fundraising efforts through purchasing cakes, raffle tickets and chocolates! The team will now represent South Australia in the Primary School Division in the Australian Schools Teams Championship held in Sydney in the first weekend of December, when they will play against the top teams from other states and territories. 


Step 4 Register your children
