The rebranding process is about creating a new logo that establishes our school identity. We currently have three different logos displayed around our school grounds and our aim is to create one modern design that accurately reflects our current school culture, as well as our hopes and goals for our future. The school name of East Marden will definitely remain.







Thank you for your input into our recent community survey. Similar surveys were conducted with students and staff to inform the rebranding process. Here are some of the highlights from the feedback collected.

Students shared that they:

- √ Are happy at school
- √ Recognise their abilities in persisting and never giving up
- √ Value opportunities for making and designing using their imagination
- √ Appreciate existing play spaces
- ✓ Are excited about the nature play areas developing around the school

The school community shared that they:

- √ Appreciate the friendly atmosphere
- Value the strong wellbeing focus
- √ Value the beautiful school environment

One of the main points from the data gathered is that the diverse cultures represented in our community are strongly valued and that this adds to the learning experience at East Marden. Through the community survey, we realise that many are wondering why we are looking into rebranding and have questions about the process.

The benefits of having a new school logo include:

- Students, community and staff increasing feelings of connectedness to our school
- / The creation of a high resolution image (this is required for future building projects, as well as in cloud-based applications and websites)
- ✓ An image with more commonly used dimensions that work with our software systems

As the rebranding process unfolds, there will be further opportunities for community input and we greatly value your opinion and thoughts. Students will be consulted regularly throughout the rebranding process.

The community will be consulted if changes will be made to the uniform.

We are looking forward to refreshing our logo as we unveil the new STEM space, new nature play areas and plans for the Better Schools Project over the next few years!

CHESS NEWS

We may still be in the midst of a chilly winter, yet activities on the chessboards have been red hot and intense!

This year's South Australian Interschool Chess Competitions began on Friday 11th May, and the 4th round is on this Friday. This year, we have 7 teams participating in A, B and C Grades, and we are doing fairly well at this stage.

Our A Grade Team now sits on 2nd on the ladder, behind the leader Prince Alfred College. These two strong teams are to meet this Friday – a possible season decider! Our B Grade team, made up of Connor, Dwij, Leon and Tharan, is in the top 4 amongst a field of 10 and has beaten Yrs 6 and 7 players along the way! As a "State First", we have an all-girls team from a co-ed school (state or private!). The players are: Jasmine, Sanggeetha, Hannah and Amelia, and they are currently 2nd in their division, having knocked out teams from Prince Alfred College and Seymour College! Also our other young teams are taking the opportunities to learn and enjoy their chess. So well done, all! Good luck this round!

In the upcoming school holidays, the following junior tournaments will be held in the Chess Centre in the city: 2018 State U12 through to State U18 Championships, and 2018 July Junior (for players aged 10 and under). These are fantastic opportunities not only for dedicated junior chess players to come hone their craft but also as stepping stones to senior and national events. In the last holidays, players from our school had performed very well. In the Under 9 Championship, Charles T. was 1st, just ahead of Connor C. (aged 5!!). Athena R. won the Under 12 Tournament and Celeb T. was a point behind at 4th. Ethan R. was tied 2nd in the Under 21 Championship, and was awarded as 1st in its Under 13 Section.

Currently at school, there is the Monday lunch time class for advanced and competitive players, the Wednesday lunch time class for beginners and the Excel Class held after school on Wednesday.

QR Code Book Reviews

During Term 1, as a Library initiative, we placed a call for any students in Years 5-7 who would like to do a review on **new** books. This enables students to provide their opinion on a book and then in turn recommend it for other students. The students select titles from Picture Fiction books to Year 7 novels before they go onto the shelves for borrowing.

What is a QR Code?

A QR code is an abbreviation for a Quick Response Code. The barcode (QR code) is a label that contains information about the item that is attached, in this case, a student's book review.

How do you download the QR code?


CLICK on the link https://www.scan.me/download/ to go to a QR Scanner or simply go to Google Play and download a free one of your choice.

Once you download a QR scanner, simply point your device at the QR code and it will take you to the link, this is where a pdf file of the student's book review can be viewed and read. Share it with your children, suggest the title to them to borrow next time they come to the library and listen to their opinion on the book.

ONLINE GAME

Students are not to bring any games downloaded from home to school. This is strictly not allowed.



Fortnite is an online gaming platform allowing up to 100 users per game to drop on to an island/map in the hunt for weapons and equipment. The users then hunt each other down in the hope to become number 1.

Battle Royale mode provided by epic games is free to download and available for everyone. Users have the choice to buy cosmetic items (micro transactions) which allows their character to look unique to others.

Concerns

Users are able to connect with other random users around the world. When holding down 'T' the game will allow the user to chat with any other: user. This poses potentially inappropriate contact between users.

Be aware if your child is using your App Store / Google Play Store to play Fortnite they may be able to use the micro transaction function which will spend money off the linked credit card to the account.

How do I report / unfriend another user?

Users can report other users for harassment, inappropriate language, bullying and hacking.

To report

Fortnite recently updated their standard contact interface to accommodate player reports. Just click 'Email Us' and fill out the required fields. After selecting the Product and Game Mode, select Report Player as the Issue Type. This will make sure these reports are routed to the correct team.

A few helpful tips when reporting players:

Make sure to include the player(s) full in-game name, spelled as accurately as possible! If it looks like the player is using unusual or uncommon characters in their in-game name, screenshots are totally acceptable documentation. Speaking of screenshots: screenshots & video are incredibly useful for validation. If you captured

screenshots or videos of the offence, attach them. If you have links to streaming video of bad behaviour, include them!

If a user wants to delete a 'friend' within the game they can simply go to the icon on the top right of the screen with the three figures and select the user and click 'unfriend'. There is no way to block a user in the game. If a user is harassing another user they should follow the appropriate steps above to report them.

Make sure you talk to your child about appropriate behaviour whilst they are playing video games. It is never okay to bully or be mean to other players. If your child is getting bullied or harassed make sure they know that they can always come to you or a trusted adult for assistance.

If things get too intense within the game, make sure they know that they can always mute other players or simply leave the game. Your young person also needs to be aware to never disclose personal or private information to other users within the game and to only talk to people about the game itself.

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Word Study

We continue our focus on Word Study through an emphasis on teaching of spelling and grammar. Teachers and students have been learning and using strategies to empower their spelling skills.

Here's an example





over 390 words

The phonogram ay is used at the end of a word to say /a/.

e.g. to-day, may, pay, ray

ai never goes at the end of an English word.

If a is at the end of a word it makes the sound /u/.

e.g. extra

ay is used at the end of a syllable to say /a/.

This strategy helps with our spelling as it teaches to use ay at the end of a word.

Note: When spelling eigh or ey is seldom used. e.g. neigh, weigh, sleigh ey is used in only a few more words. e.g. they, obey, grey, survey.

This helps with reading as it teaches us to read a as /u/ at the end of a word.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday are the week days. Saturday and Sunday are the days of the weekend.
